


2020 Operational Efficiencies

2021 Proposed Capital Projects

- New OPP satellite Office in the Seniors Centre Addition in Bolton
 - Budget of \$400,000 funded from Regional DC's and OPP Capital Infrastructure Reserve
- Ancillary Building – To construct a 2500 square foot enclosed building for a larger secure space for evidence storage.
 - Budget of \$1,104,675 funded from Regional DC's



Current Reserve Fund balances

Reserve fund balances have sufficient funds to fund proposed 2021 OPP capital projects and proposed draws to fund the operating budget

- \$5.5 million Caledon Policing Stabilization Reserve
- \$7.3 million OPP Capital Infrastructure Reserve
- Region is updating their DC background study to capture the proposed capital projects
