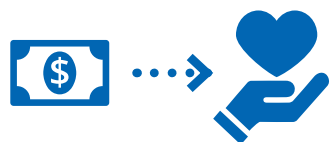


# Investing to improve lives in Peel

### Core Fund

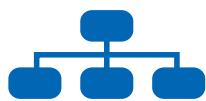
*Helping agencies deliver the right supports for now and the future*

Total Investment:

**\$5,037,970**

The Indigenous Network received

Supported core operational expenses to provide programs & services to the Urban Indigenous population of Mississauga and neighbouring regions.



### Capacity Fund

*Strengthen agencies foundations to better meet their needs during COVID-19*

Total Investment:

**\$700,522**

Afro Caribbean Business Network Foundation Canada received  
**\$ 24,120**

Supported the development of core leadership training for Black youth and single mothers in Peel during COVID-19.



### Change Fund

*Empowering collaboratives to stabilize, rebuild and reconvene during COVID-19*

Total Investment:

Supported development of a systems pathway to support racialized communities through the justice and mental health system.



### Small Capital Fund

### Community Hubs Fund
