



## **Recent History of CA Act Changes**

2015	Province (Liberal Government) initiates review of CA Act
2017	<ul> <li>December Bill 139 passes but elements not proclaimed before June 2018 election</li> </ul>
2019	<ul> <li>April 5<sup>th</sup> Province posts proposals to change to the CA Act to ERO</li> <li>Bill 108 tabled with changes to the CA Act before ERO posting closed;</li> <li>Bill 108 passes June 6<sup>th</sup>,2019</li> <li>Individual CA meetings with Minister and MECP staff - November</li> </ul>
2020	<ul> <li>January and February multi-stakeholder consultation sessions</li> <li>March 2020 – MECP Online Survey</li> </ul>
2020	<ul> <li>November 5<sup>th</sup> Bill 229 tabled with Schedule 6 containing additional changes to the CA Act and Planning Act</li> <li>Bill 229 with Schedule 6 passes December 8<sup>th</sup>, 2020.</li> </ul>

## Flood Advisor's and PPS 2020 Recognition of CAs

- The 2019 Provincial Flood Advisor's report notes the important role conservation authorities play in the lands use planning process, with the main legislative tools to manage flood risk being the Planning Act together with the PPS and CA Act
- "The Province is committed to working with municipalities, the federal government, homeowners, conservation authorities, industry and Indigenous communities to advance the actions contained within this Strategy."





## **ERO** posting





Regulations Consultation Guide posted to ERO is broadly about governance, transparency, accountability and consistency:

- Mandatory programs and services
- Proposed agreements with participating municipalities for non-mandatory programs and services when funding provided by municipalities
- Transition period to establish agreements
- Requirements for each CA to establish a community advisory board
- Minister's section 29 regulation relating to conservation authority operation and management of lands owned by the authority

## **Proposed CA Act Regulations**

#### Transparency and Consistency

- Mandatory
  - The risk of natural hazards
  - II. Duties, functions and responsibilities as a source protection authority Clean Water Act, 2006
  - III. Lake Simcoe Protection Act
  - IV. Section 29 Lands Management
  - V. Other programs and services prescribed by regulation:
    - a) Core Watershed-based Resource Management Strategy
    - b) Provincial Water Quality and Quantity Monitoring (stream and groundwater)
- 2. Non-mandatory programs and services on behalf of a municipality related to watershed management/planning
- 3. Non-mandatory programs and services a CA determines advisable to meet purpose of the Act
- 4. Fully self-funded CA programs

#### Accountability

- Categories 2 and 3 require agreements by January 1, 2023
- Community Advisory Board

Section 29 "Conservation Areas" regulation – CA owned land

- Land Management on CA Owned Land for Recreation Purposes
- Land management on CA Owned Land for Education, Training and Cultural Purposes





- Stormwater Management

## Complying with Expected Regulations within Peel Region

- Peel CAs already have established and well-regarded process for budget consultations and discussions with the Region
- CAs will consult with Peel staff as Transition Plans are drafted
- Discussions can take place through existing Region-CA budget processes, including through proposed CA Governance Model being confirmed with Region of Peel staff.
- MOU(s) and associated agreements to be brought to Council for approval, recognizing Provincial timelines and Regional municipal election in 2022.
