


Rats are present in our environment

Between 2017-2020 (as of September 24, 2020)

- Peel Health has received 330 rat-related complaints:
 - 150 in Brampton
 - 10 in Caledon
 - 170 in Mississauga
- The numbers are variable from year to year.

Rat-borne illness in Peel

Current context in Peel: risk of rat-borne disease is low

- Incidence of reportable rat-borne disease in Peel:
 - No human cases of plague in Canada since 1939
 - No cases of viral hemorrhagic fever, hantavirus pulmonary syndrome or tularemia in Ontario in the past 10 years
 - Can carry gastrointestinal illness (E. coli, Campylobacter, Salmonella) – however, of the cases annually reported to Peel Public Health, none were linked to rats; the majority were linked to travel and improper handling of food.

Responsibility of Public Health with Rats

 Inspection of food premises and enforcement of the Food Regulations

- Response to rat complaints on private property
- Inspection of the premises rat droppings/burrows
- Education and Advice both on the property and on surrounding properties
- Referrals to Property Services/By-law if warranted



IPM is a decision making process that anticipates and prevents pest activity and infestation by combining several tactics to achieve long-term solutions.







Integrated Pest Management (IPM)

Five Basic Steps

- 1. On-going surveys
- 2. Keeping our garbage tidy and secure
- 3. Keep our buildings tight.
- 4. Non chemical tools (traps, etc)
- 5. Chemical (Pesticides)...

Key to a Successful Program

- Create new "IPM Team"
- Develop strategy for rodent population reduction
- Implement Strategy based on IPM principles
 - Use preventative measures
 - Develop monitoring and identification program
 - Focus on education
 - Conduct regular inspection
 - Establish an "Action Threshold"
 - Environmentally compatible & Economically feasible
 - Evaluate effectiveness



Key considerations of a successful Subsidy program..

- A subsidy program would...
 - Reimburse 50% of professional services to a max of \$200/year per residential address
 - Be focused for Residential use only
 - Would see Residents receive subsidy for pest control vendor they hire
 - Would include qualification criteria for eligibility ie. no bird feeders, good overall condition, no excess waste
 - Would focus on Education and other methods to eliminate pests
