Peel Long Term Care Centres

- 435 people participated in adult day services
 - 97 per cent say the program helped achieve, maintain or improve their wellbeing
 - Two out of three have a cognitive impairment, including dementia
- 936 people live in five municipal long term care (LTC) homes
 - 84 per cent would recommend their LTC home to others
 - The median age is 85 years old
 - 83 per cent have a cognitive impairment, including dementia

Quality of Care

- Awarded three-year accreditation
- All six indicators trend **better** than provincial averages
