Corrective Actions	<p>Additional training with clinic leads to re-affirm trigger points and notification procedures / conditions was conducted</p> <p>Semi-regular touch base meetings with clinic leads to further refine procedures took place as the vaccination program ramped up and expanded</p>
Additional Notes	Roughly 140 reported events from the clinics were received during their operations from mid-February to mid-September using the above validated procedures
