Dear Premier Ford,

On behalf of Regional Council, I would like to take the opportunity once again to thank you and your government for the leadership you have shown in response to COVID-19 and your continued support of the residents and businesses of Peel as we continue to combat the pandemic.

At its meeting yesterday, Regional Council approved a motion calling on the Ontario government to enact legislation to prohibit protests related to COVID-19 public health measures or vaccination mandates that occur in close proximity to hospitals, healthcare facilities or schools, as these disruptive crowds are impeding and delaying access to these facilities and critical health services. Regional Council is particularly concerned that these protests pose a serious threat to the health and safety of employees working in these locations, as well as students and those who require medical care.

Protests are not just occurring in our province, but across the country. Yesterday, the Quebec government passed legislation to make it illegal to protest within 50 metres of schools, daycares, hospitals, medical clinics, COVID-19 vaccination sites and testing centres in their jurisdiction. We ask that similar measures be implemented in Ontario to help ensure that those needing medical attention have unrestricted access to health facilities, medical services and schools, and would also protect the health and safety of our already overburdened healthcare and educational workers.

Thank you for your consideration of this request and we look forward to the implementation of measures to address these serious concerns.
