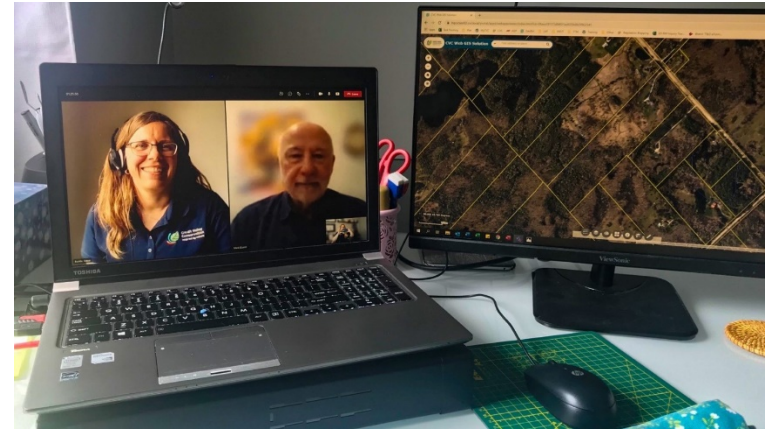

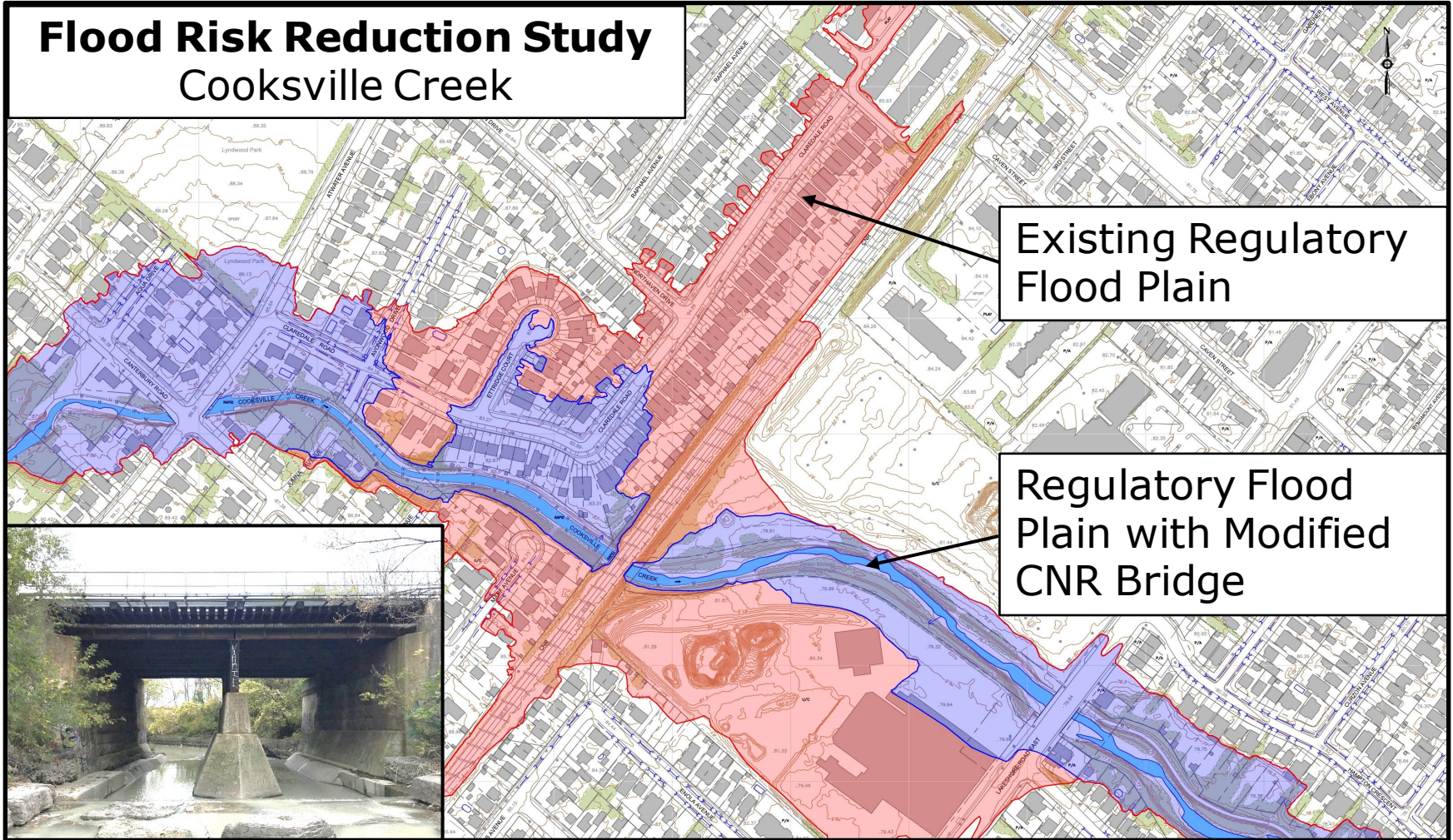

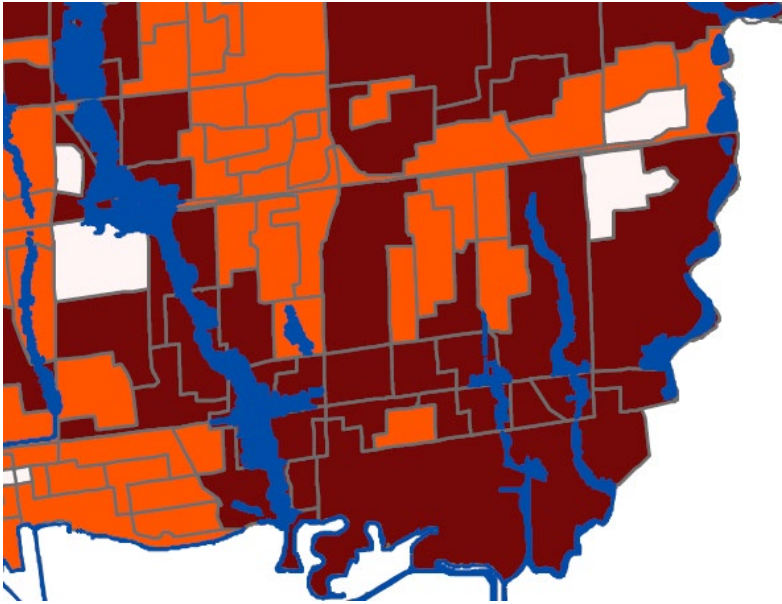

Flood Risk Reduction Study Cooksville Creek

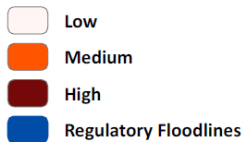


Reducing Flood Risk with Flood Plain Mapping

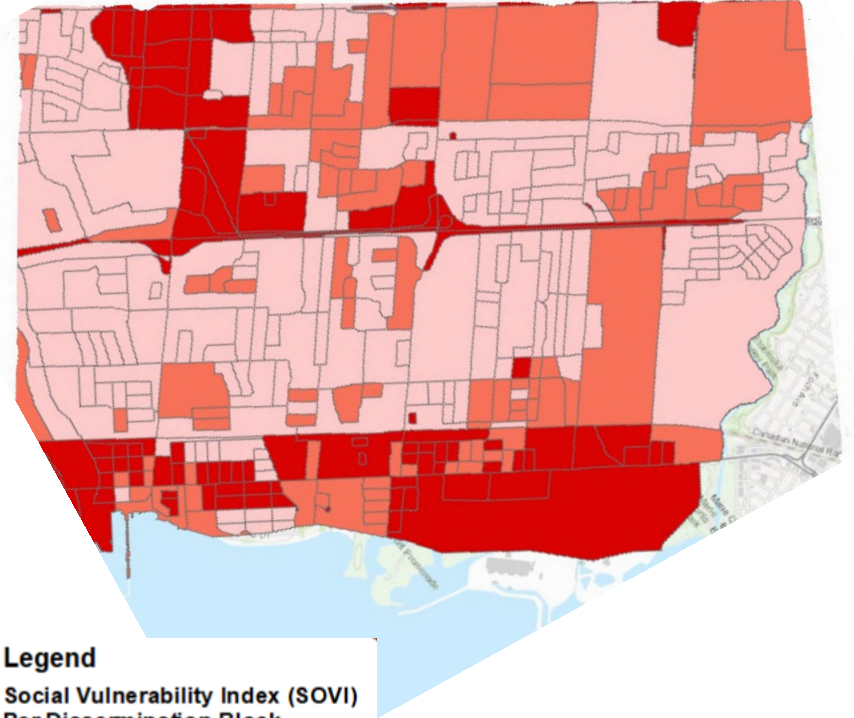
Priority Flood Risk Area

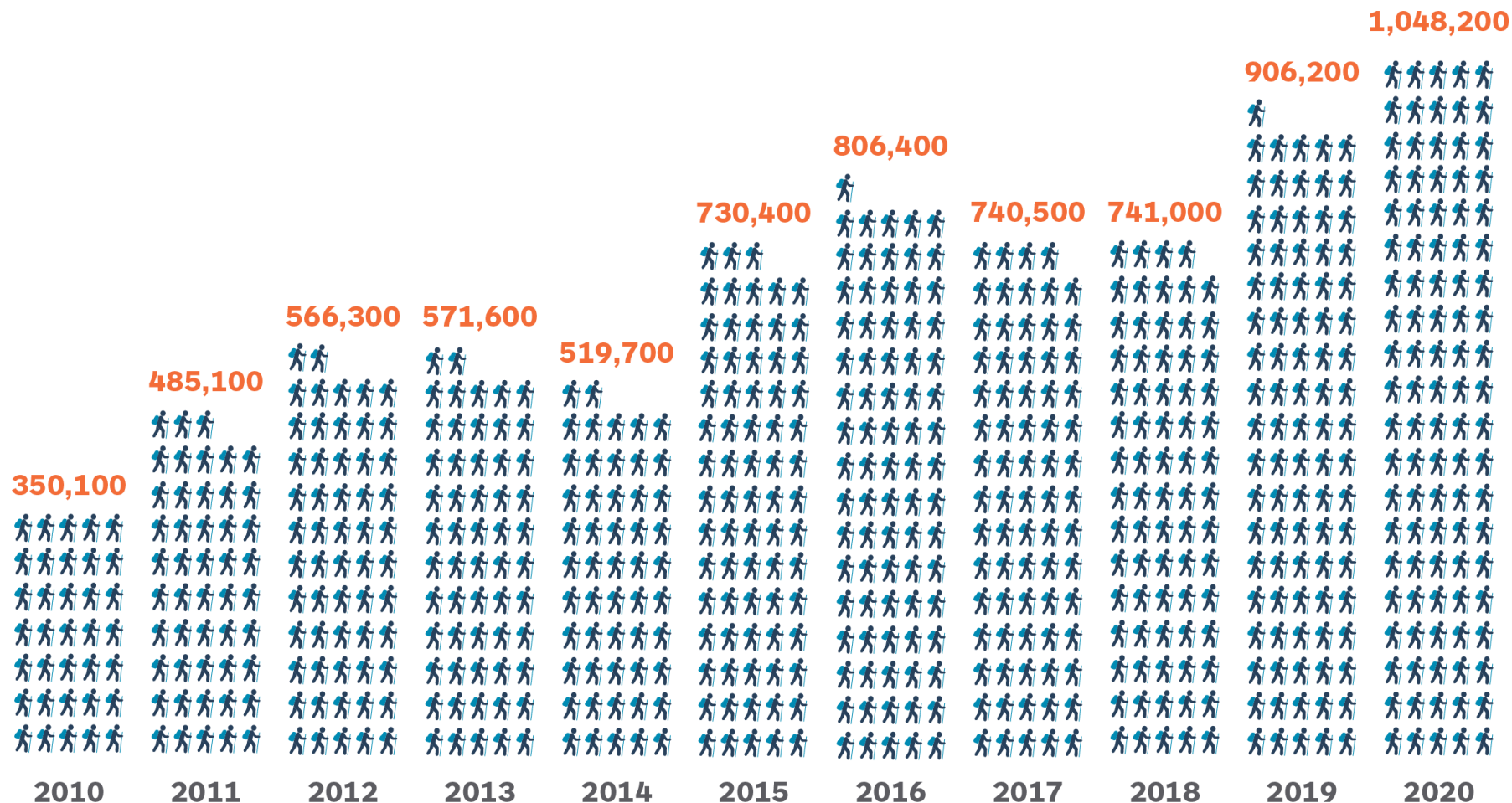

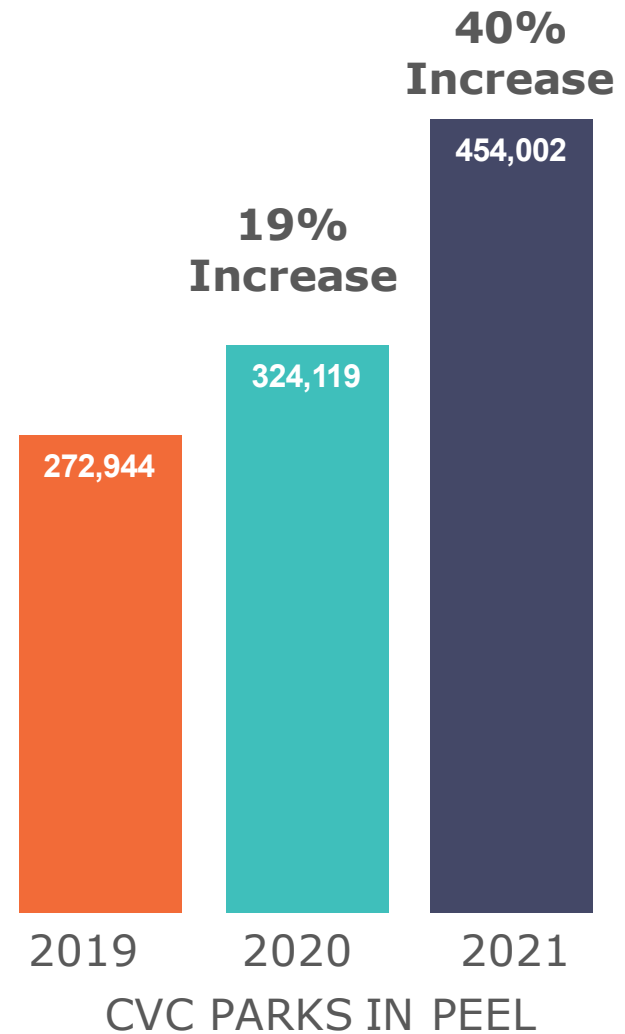
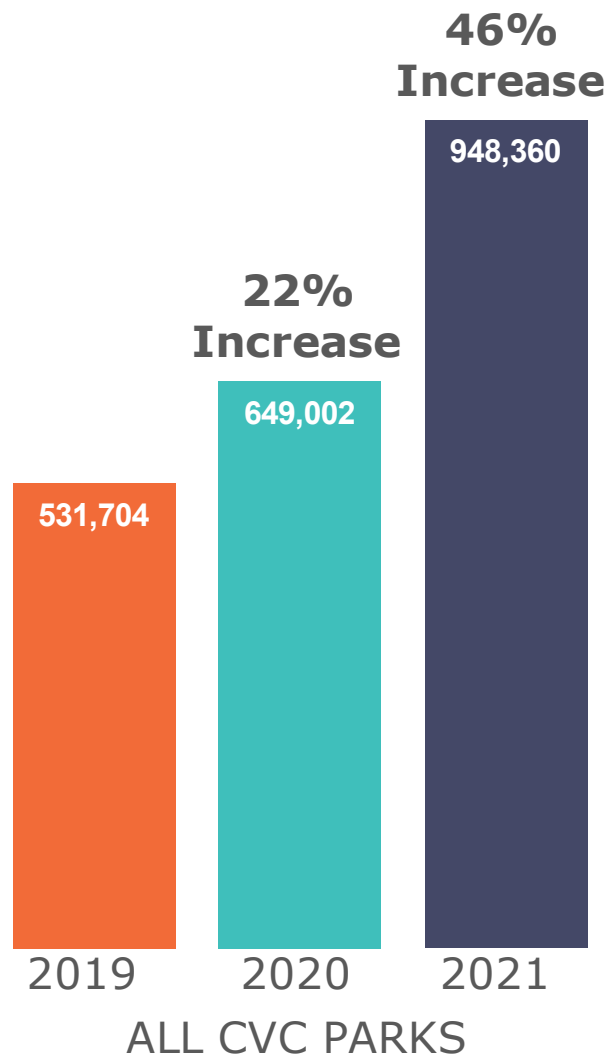

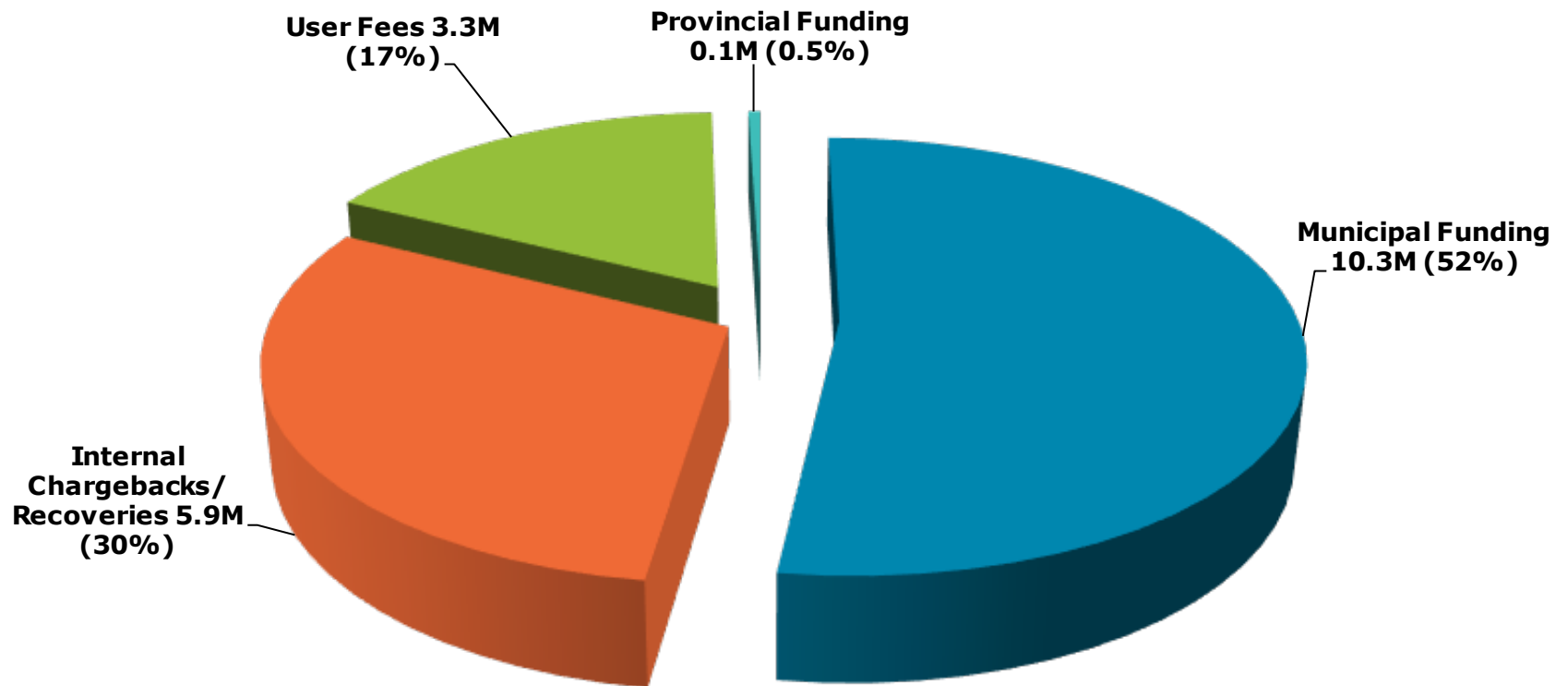

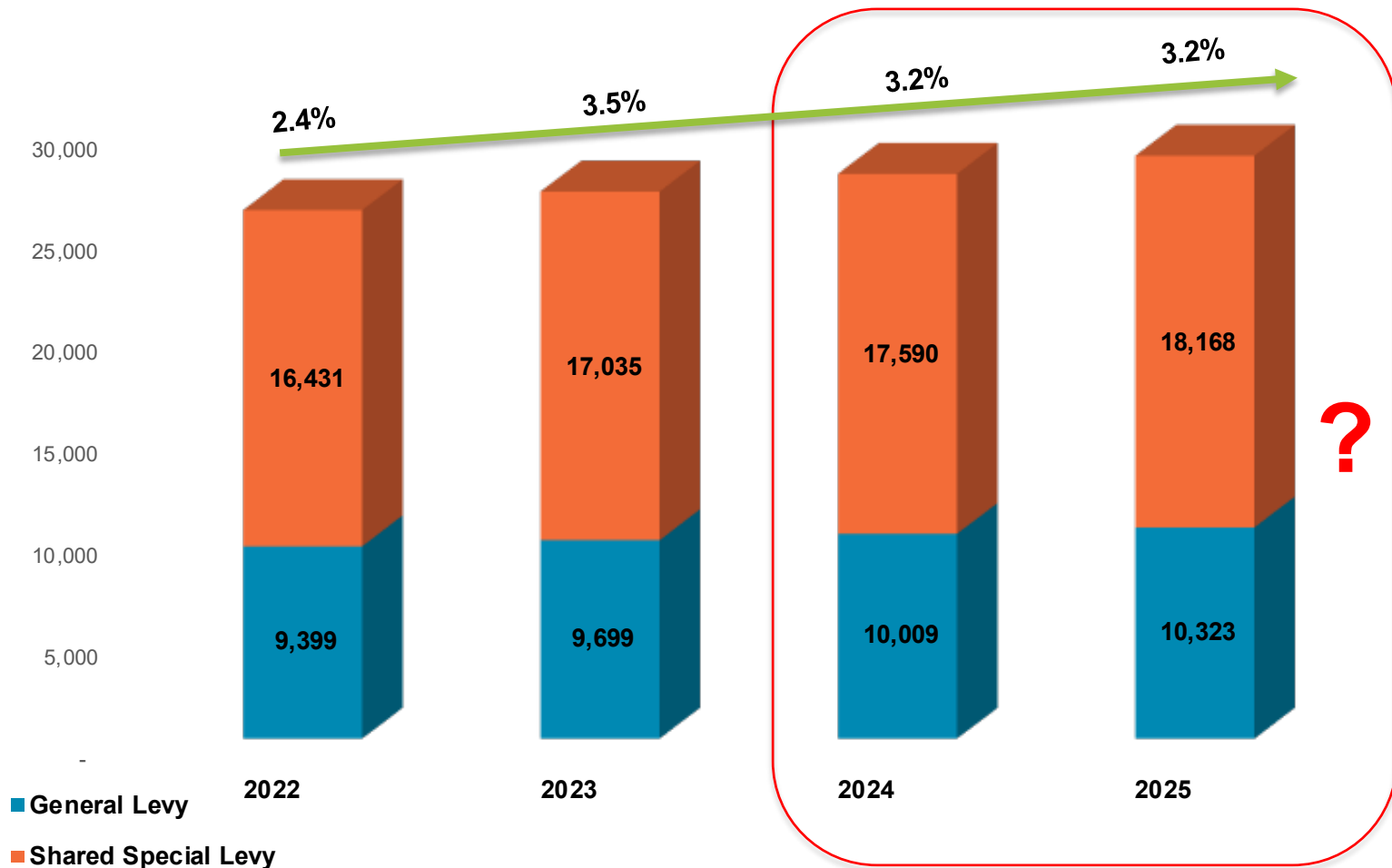

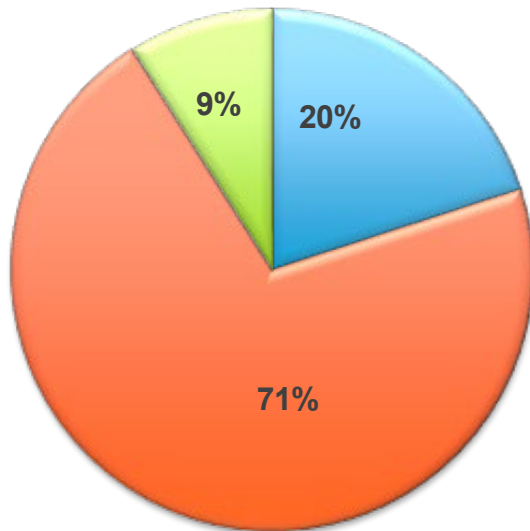
