#### **2021** Federal Speech from the Throne

- Moving forward with \$10/day child care plan
  - (Ontario has not signed agreement)
- Improving access to mental health and addictions treatment
- Strengthening long-term care

Address COVID-19 impacts, now and beyond	<ul> <li>Seeking ongoing and continued support to address the evolving needs</li> <li>Calling for stimulus infrastructure funding using an allocation-based model</li> </ul>
Focus on affordable housing solutions	<ul> <li>Provide long-term, allocation-based, sustainable capital and operational funding for affordable housing</li> </ul>
Invest in a green economy	<ul> <li>Provide sustained funding to reduce GHG emissions &amp; address climate change risks</li> <li>Develop policy that establishes adaptation targets &amp; defines municipal resilience to climate change</li> <li>Invest in waste infrastructure &amp; technologies</li> </ul>
Keep the economy moving	<ul> <li>Invest in Peel transit projects and infrastructure around Toronto Pearson International Airport</li> </ul>

Support our community growth	Review medium- and long-term municipal fiscal sustainability
	Adequately fund provincially mandated services
Focus on affordable housing solutions	Contribute \$319.6 million for Peel's Housing Master Plan
	Convene a staff-level working group to explore housing opportunities and options
Safeguard quality of life for seniors	Support emotion-based care and enable dementia friendly design in Long-Term
	<ul> <li>Provide \$4 million in sustainable operational funding and \$30 million in capital funding for Peel Manor</li> </ul>

## **2022 Provincial Pre-budget Submission**

Prioritize investment in mental health	<ul> <li>Implement new population-based funding formulas</li> <li>Address growing waitlists and crisis levels exacerbated by COVID-19</li> </ul>
Invest in child care as an economic catalyst	<ul> <li>Sign the Canada wide child care agreement</li> <li>Work with Service System Managers on a provincial recruitment and retainment strategy</li> </ul>
Keep the economy moving	<ul> <li>Implement regulatory changes to allow the creation of AMPS for automated enforcement programs</li> </ul>

## Advocacy Update

### **MP/MPP** Briefing Sessions

- Last meetings hosted on December 17<sup>th</sup>
- Focused on Peel's Housing Affordability Crisis
  - Highlighted funding gap and associated risks
  - Reiterated that an ideal partnership: "all 3 levels of government provide equal 1/3rd of the required capital
- Next meetings scheduled for April 8, 2022
  - Focus Issues: Transportation/Highway 413 & Provincial Election priorities

#### **Housing Summit & Housing Affordability Task Force**

- Minister Clark hosted provincial/municipal summit on January 19<sup>th</sup>
- Opportunity to highlight Region's housing challenges & priorities
- Staff is reviewing Task force report & recommendations

# Advocacy Update

#### **2022 ROMA Conference Delegation Meetings**

- Housing Minister Clark
  - Continued funding for housing/homelessness support in response to COVID-19
  - Contribute \$319.6 million to Peel's Housing Master Plan
  - Increase local autonomy and improve housing affordability outcomes
- Transportation Minister Mulroney
  - Peel Transit Infrastructure
  - Vision Zero/AMPs
- Infrastructure MPP Amarjot Sandhu
  - Infrastructure Stimulus Funding/Allocation Model
  - Ensure climate change lens is applied

## 2022 Provincial Election Strategy

#### **Election Strategy - Overview**

- E-Day: June 2, 2022
- Strategy intended to influence policy development & political discourse
  - Highlight the need for strong partnerships
- Inform political parties, candidates and other stakeholders about Peel priorities
  - Based on key Council endorsed advocacy positions

  - Leverage to promote the Region's priorities
