## EXPANSION IS NOT THE SOLUTION – BUT THE PROBLEM

#### CLIMATE CHANGE

By expanding the settlement boundary, we put more prime agriculture at risk

#### CLIMATE CHANGE

Cutting down mature woodlots, and paving over greenspace increases GHG. We will not meet our GHG targets in 8 years

## AGRIFOOD INDUSTRY

Loss of a valuable farming and agrifood and equestrian industry

## FINANCIALLY NOT SOUND

Wiping out farmland will increase the cost of food and the lack of interconnectivity in the Region puts more people in cars

#### WIPING OUT SPECIES

Many species are endangered and at risk, taking out their natural habitat will result in extinction

# CALEDON IS UNDER ATTACK

98% of the 56 current development applications in Caledon are to convert prime farmland and environmentally sensitive lands for development, warehousing, trucking and housing development

As of March 20-22 there are 3000 acres of Prime Agriculture and EPA lands at risk
