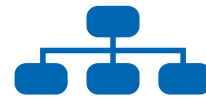
### Core Fund

*Helping agencies deliver the right supports for now and the future*

Total Investment:  
**\$4,947,328**

**Roots Community Services**  
**\$100,000**

Provides services, programs, and supports that enhance the lives of Black and Caribbean communities.



### Capacity Fund

*Strengthen agencies foundations to better meet their needs during COVID-19*

Total Investment:  
**\$1,483,613**

**Our Place Peel**  
**\$10,500**

Implement mental health education training for staff to effectively provide mental health assistance to homeless and at-risk youth.



### Change Fund

*Empowering collaboratives to stabilize, rebuild and reconvene during COVID-19*

**Mississauga Food Bank**  
**\$50,000**

Developed a grocery model to provide 18,000 pre-packed hampers. 8,000 clients reached, and 130 volunteers engaged.
