

## Piloting Referral Programs

- Pilot program offering assistance to over 140 people through redirection to addiction services (PCHS/PAARC).
- Resulting in a 78% referral acceptance rate.

# Strengthening Crisis Response



## Meet our Crisis Response Teams

Peel Regional Police's crisis response teams are there to ensure that those in need of mental health, addiction and intimate partner violence support and intervention receive the care and access to resources they deserve.



### CCRRT: Community Crisis Rapid Response Team

Crisis personnel from partner agencies attend low-risk mental health calls and provide on-site support.



### ECCRRT: Embedded Community Crisis Rapid Response Team

Crisis personnel resolve low-risk mental health calls and assist individuals by phone.



### MCCRRT: Mobile Community Crisis Rapid Response Team

Police and crisis personnel attend high-risk mental health calls together to provide immediate support.



### COAST: Crisis Outreach and Support Team

Police and crisis personnel follow up on calls for assistance made through the Embedded Community Crisis Rapid Response Team.



### SCRT: Safe Centre Response Team

Police and a mobile support worker attend intimate partner incidents to provide early intervention and support to assist families.

- First-ever Auto Theft Summit in partnership with multiple Ontario-based police agencies, local and provincial government and industry stakeholders.
- Continue to be one of the lead services in auto theft investigations recovering over \$89 million dollars in stolen vehicles in 2022.

## Supporting Victims of Gender-based Violence

- Dedicated IPV Unit as part of the largest Family Justice Centre in Canada – Safe Centre of Peel.
- Setting the gold standard through our service delivery model.

## Curbing Guns, Gangs and Drug Activity

- Enhanced Enforcement Programing.
- Recorded the two largest drug seizures in Peel Police history (2022).
- 377 firearms seized (June 1 2022-May 31 2023).
