Mandatory Programs and Services

Programs and services which all CAs must provide in their jurisdiction

Eligible to be included in participating municipality levy without an agreement

Category 2

Municipal Programs and Services

Programs and services which a CA agrees to provide on behalf of a municipality

Eligible to be included in participating municipality levy, if provided for in an MOU or other agreement

Other

Programs and Services

Programs and services that a CA determines are advisable to further the purpose of the Act

Eligible to be included in participating municipality levy, if provided for through a cost apportioning agreement

Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs)

- CAs and participating municipalities are required by the Conservation
 Authorities Act to enter into MOUs in order for CAs to deliver Category
 2/municipally-requested services by January 1, 2024
- CVC, TRCA and Region of Peel have a collaborative and transparent budget process to identify and deliver joint priorities
- MOUs allow municipally-requested services to continue to be delivered and funded through existing budget processes with participating municipalities
- CAs and Peel Region must enter into MOUs to cover the 2024 budget year






TRCA - Erosion

- Implementation of bank stabilization and sanitary infrastructure protection:
 - 3 sites (2 critical priority) at Hazelwood Park South (Brampton)
 - 1 site at the watercourse near Bramalea
 Rd. & Queen St. (Brampton)
- Planning and design of 8 sites for future implementation:
 - Crawley Park (Brampton)
 - Derry Greenway (Mississauga)
 - Jayfield Park (Brampton)

CVC - Erosion

- Expanding stream power mapping tool to 3rd order watercourses to support erosion management across the watershed
- Fletcher's Creek erosion inventory (Brampton)
- Continuing to manage erosion hazards through the permit review process





TRCA - Knowledge

- Operate 12 real-time stream and precipitation gauge stations, 5 remote stream, 3 precipitation gauges and collect monthly water quality samples at 51 Surface Water Quality stations (13 Provincial Water Quality Monitoring sites)
- CTC Source Protection Plan implementation
 & update to TRSPA Assessment Report
- Conservation authority planning and knowledge protects property, people & investments through safe, suitable and science-backed development decisions

CVC – Watershed Planning

- Credit River Watershed Plan Phase 1 and Phase 2 (Caledon, Brampton, Mississauga)
- Accelerating the delivery of watershed planning implementation tools
- Source water protection outreach continues with webinars, newsletters, social media and on-site well and septic assessments.



CVC - Knowledge




TRCA - Restoration

- Eastbourne Park conceptual designs completed, channel naturalization construction initiated, 50% completion in 2023, 100% by Fall 2024 (Brampton)
- Detailed designs for remainder of Eastbourne and Fallingdale underway (Brampton)
- Invasive Species Management at Albion Hills, Claireville and Heart Lake (Caledon, Brampton):
 - 4 ha managed
 - 1.5 ha field of European buckthorn removal & new infrastructure
- 45m bank stabilization complete including plantings at Paul Coffey Park (Mississauga)
- \$2.5 million awarded in 2023 across 5 grants in Peel, leveraging over \$3.3 million municipal funds for community impact

CVC - Restoration

- Caledon Creek Forest plantation thinned (2 other sites marked for 2023)
- 19,165 trees and shrubs planted at 8 properties
- 10.2 ha of grassland and meadow habitat creation with 4 private landowners engaged
- 3 priority hemlock stands surveyed for Hemlock Wooly Adelgid (2 CAs and Forks of the Credit Provincial Park)
- 22 ha Invasive species management inventoried at 5 CAs
- East Credit Dam decommissioning Feasibility Study completed and detailed design underway (Caledon)

TRCA - Stewardship

- SNAP Locations: Chelsea Gardens (Brampton),
 Stationview Place and Jane's Place (Caledon)
 - Concept Plans
 - Advancing Growing Healthy Towers
 - Tenant Engagement
- Collaborating with the Black Youth Farming Collective at the McVean farm to support their training program and highlight the importance of local food
- 1k participants planted 4k trees and shrubs across 26 events in Peel
- 4k children from 56 schools participated in Peel Children's Water Festival

CVC - Stewardship

- 1.8k youth, community, and corporate volunteers planted 4k trees, picked up 600lbs of litter, and restored 3 ha of land at 50 events (Caledon, Brampton, Mississauga)
- ALUS Peel pilot program had 18 ha of private land enrolled (Caledon)
- 2023 target for private land tree planting met and launched a campaign to enroll more.
- Urban home tree planting on track to reach
 450 homeowners in Fletchers Creek SNAP
 and 3 priority wards of Mississauga
- Sustainable landscaping assessments at 6 corporate sites and implementation of 5 green infrastructure projects (Mississauga)

TRCA - Education

- EcoSchools engages with 226k students and 24k staff, representing two of the Region of Peel's largest employers
- Environmental Leaders of Tomorrow Program: 20 classes and 520 students, targeting priority communities for access to environment learning services
- Redevelopment of former TDSB operated Etobicoke Field Studies Centre at Claireville Conservation Area as the Claireville Nature Centre with year-round programs (Brampton)
- Enhanced programming at Albion Hills

CVC - Education

- 2.6k kindergarten to grade 5 students took field trips to Terra Cotta Conservation Area's Education Centre
- 620 grade 6-12 students received in-school Branch Out presentations (Caledon, Brampton, Mississauga)
