Current State of Poverty in Peel Region



Unaffordability Risks Due to High Interest Rates and Rising Inflation

(e.g., Average inflation rose 6.8% with the average Canadian hourly wage rate rising only 4.5%.)



The Housing Crisis

(e.g., An estimated 91,000 households across Peel are in core housing need.

Single income households, Black households, and immigrants are disproportionately impacted.)



Precarious Employment and the Increasing Need for Sufficient Income Supports

(e.g., The Ontario Works benefit rate was last updated in 2018 to a maximum of \$733 per month and has been eroded by inflation to \$636 in Dec 2022.)



The Rise in Food Insecurity

(e.g., Food prices rose by 15.8% between December 2020 and December 2022 and the number of food bank visits increased by 42% since 2019.)
