128 known encampments

167% increase since 2022



4,000 clients used shelter system

43% from 2021



270% occupancy in shelter system

 - ✓ Reach people earlier, focus on families and youth
- Permanent Affordable Housing Solutions
 - ✓ More Community and Supportive Housing
 - ✓ More subsidies
 - ✓ More supports

Manage Homelessness

- Cost Effective
 Crisis/Emergency Response
 - ✓ More drop-in / homelessness respite programs
 - Serve asylum claimants outside of shelter system
 - ✓ Implement Place-Based Outreach Program
 - ✓ Remove known barriers to shelter use
 - ✓ Increase shelter beds explore modular
