Federal COVID-19 Response

- Acting quickly to keeping Canadians safe and healthy
- Providing “rigorous” & “vigorous” support to workers and employers to ensure swift economic recovery (Canada’s COVID-19 Economic Response Plan)
- Working closely with provinces to support vulnerable populations, essential workers and commercial tenants
- On June 5th – Committed \$14 billion to provinces to help with municipal recovery efforts

Provincial COVID-19 Response

- Committed to working closely with federal and municipal partners to keep Ontarians safe and healthy
- Implementing and extending the Declaration of Emergency under the Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act since March 17th
- Released Ontario's Reopening Framework (April 27th) – Areas outside the GTA and Golden Horseshoe entered Stage 2 on June 12th, expanding to all areas except Peel, Toronto and Windsor-Essex on June 19th
- Providing financial support to businesses and individuals impacted by COVID-19
- Passage of *Bill 189, Coronavirus (COVID-19) Support and Protection Act, 2020* (amends *Planning Act & DC Act*)

Looking Forward: Region of Peel Priorities Update

- The Region remains committed to advance all its key priorities that will help achieve Regional short and long-term objectives.
- In response to COVID-19, the Region has shifted efforts to advance priorities that will help address challenges resulting from the pandemic.
