Community's Opposition to Conversion of Site 1 - Statistics

	Opposition to Site 1 Conversion

Community Engagement meeting on Sept 20, 2023 (Hope Church, Mississauga)	Over 80%
Residents unaware of the Employment Sites Review project (based on 300 door-to-door interactions)	Over 90%
Comments on the Employments Sites Review website (https://yoursay.mississauga.ca/esr)	Over 80%

Lack of Communication

- Tenants were notified but not engaged by SmartCentres leading to frustration among retailers/tenants
- Majority of local residents remain unaware of the proposed conversion post community engagement meeting on Sept 20, 2023

Conclusion: Local community overwhelmingly oppose Conversion of Site 1.
