Housing Targets by 2031

	Housing Units
Ontario's 10-year Housing Target for Mississauga	120,000
Mississauga's Housing Action Plan ("Growing Mississauga") Housing Target	120,000
Existing "Mississauga Official Plan" land use structure allows for construction of (exceeds Mississauga's residential development and growth forecasts)	250,000 ¹

Municipal Comprehensive Review (MCR) Conversion Criteria	SmartCentres Site 1
There is a need for a conversion	The Site is not needed to meet residential growth targets as Mississauga Official Plan already identifies areas for residential development and growth that would exceed forecasts ²

Residents unaware of the Employment Sites Review project (based on 300 door-to-door interactions)	Over 90%

Lack of Communication

- Tenants were notified but not engaged by SmartCentres leading to frustration among retailers/tenants
- Majority of local residents remain unaware of the proposed conversion post community engagement meeting on Sept 20, 2023

Conclusion: Local community overwhelmingly opposes the Conversion of Site 1, and it must be considered prior to any decisions being made.

Next Steps

Urge Regional Councillors to vote against the conversion of Site 1 because

- There is no evidence indicating a need for conversion as per the City of Mississauga's Recommendation Report
- Community overwhelmingly oppose conversion

Media follow-up

- Insauga.com has already covered Site 1 conversion and is interested in a follow-up story
- Other media outlets are also interested in the update
- Continue to represent the community and oppose the conversion
