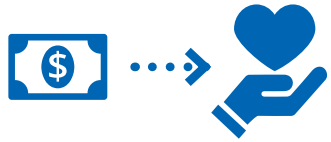


# Investing to improve lives in Peel

The Community Investment Program invests exclusively in not-for-profit agencies' core operations to strengthen organizational capacity and achieve greater impact on Peel's overall social services system.

## Investments by Funds



### Core Fund

*258 positions funded to support agencies during the restorative and maintenance phases of the pandemic.*

Total Investment:  
**\$6,551,120**

**BGC Peel (Boys and Girls Club of Peel)** received  
**\$ 100,000**

Support stabilization of key staffing positions (finance, operations) and increased infrastructure costs (ie. Rent).



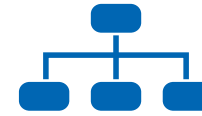
### Social Purpose Enterprise Fund

*2 Social Enterprise were funded to diversify its revenue throughout the pandemic and develop innovative approaches to strengthen the social enterprise sector.*

Total Investment:  
**\$300,000**

**Peel Senior Link** received  
**\$ 150,000**

Social enterprise that increases access to health and culturally appropriate food for seniors through a café and tuck shop in the new Seniors, Health and Wellness Village at Peel Manor.



### Capacity Fund

*Support organizational capacity building activities and tools to strengthen Peel's not-for-profit sector.*

Total Investment:  
**\$2,225,544**

**Restoration and Empowerment for Social Transition** received  
**\$ 30,000**

Develop a comprehensive data collection and evaluation framework in Salesforce to track real-time monitoring and evaluation of clients' progress with milestones on service needs.



### Food Security Capital and Innovation Fund

*17 agencies funded to support increase demand for emergency food.*

**\$2,000,000**

**Sai Dham** received  
**\$ 75,000**

Support the cost of 13,200 annual food hampers to Seniors in Peel.
