


Update on the Community Safety and Well-Being Plan

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Background: Legislation

- Existing requirements in the *Police Services Act, 1990* and in the new [Community Safety and Policing Act, 2019](#), once in force, require municipal councils to prepare and adopt a community safety and well-being plan.
- The legislation requires that the Plan:
 - Identify and prioritize community risk factors
 - Identify strategies to reduce the prioritized risk factors
 - Include a sustainable system to monitor, evaluate and report on the effect of the Plan
 - Be reviewed and revised at regular intervals
 - Be supported by an advisory committee with legislated membership

CSWB Plan Vision & Mission

Vision: Peel is a safe, inclusive and connected community where all residents thrive.

Mission: We will work together to ensure access to services and supports that advance safety, connectedness and well-being for all Peel residents.

Community Safety and Well-being: “the ideal state of a sustainable community where everyone is safe, has a sense of belonging, opportunities to participate, and where individuals and families are able to meet their needs for education, health care, food, housing, income, and social and cultural expression”. (Ministry of the Solicitor General, *Community Safety and Well-Being Planning Framework: A Shared Commitment in Ontario*, 2018)

Family Violence

Draft Goals

1. Create and strengthen Peel's pathways to safety
2. Increase awareness and public education of family violence

Emerging Opportunities

- Develop a public education and awareness campaign to highlight the issue of domestic violence (Council Feb 13, 2020)
- Collective response to needs identified through Community Response Table

Mental Health & Addictions

Draft Goals

1. Promote mental wellness and positive relationships among youth and families
2. Improve access to mental health and addictions services and supports for youth by simplifying pathways and coordinating response

Emerging Opportunities

- Advocacy
 - for equitable funding formula (children and adults)
 - additional funding to address historic shortfalls (Council Resolution, June 25/20)
- Develop a targeted awareness and advocacy campaign that illustrates local experiences with inadequate access (Council Resolution, June 25/20)
- Ongoing community discussion to address recent deaths involving police and individuals in mental health crisis

Systemic Discrimination

Draft Goals

1. Publicly review, develop and sustain anti-oppressive and equity practices and policies in Peel
2. Implement effective data gathering and reporting practices in order to assess impact and respond to inequities

Emerging Opportunities

- Address systemic discrimination by supporting policies and programs that address the inequities that the Black community and other marginalized groups continue to experience within Peel (Council Resolution, June 11, 2020)

Risk Considerations for CSWB in Peel

Global:

Chronic underfunding across most community sectors in Peel compromises innovation and ability to improve systems

Community:

No identified funding source for ongoing community engagement and implementation strategies

Partners:

Multiple demands on partners to support implementation and aligned activities already underway, such as the domestic violence awareness campaign

Region:

Turnover of contracted staff and resulting vacancies. Partner support has been extraordinary but may be difficult to maintain without ongoing Regional support.
