





Paid Duty



Officers hired by individual or business for specific events or functions, when they are not on regular shifts or official duties

Ministry of Transportation Requirement:

If construction work is being conducted within 30 metres of an intersection with operating signals then a paid duty officer is required

Of paid duty requests in 2023 were for construction sites as Peel continues to build and grow








Call Response Time (minutes)






Exponential Population Growth




Increase in population growth, multigenerational households as well as registered vehicles means more demands on our services.



Officers per 100,000 Population




Common denominators include population 1M+, growth rates, urban density, international airport and crime severity index.






Operational Budget Breakdown


