impacting moderate income households renting, aspiring to own, or trying to upsize for a growing family.



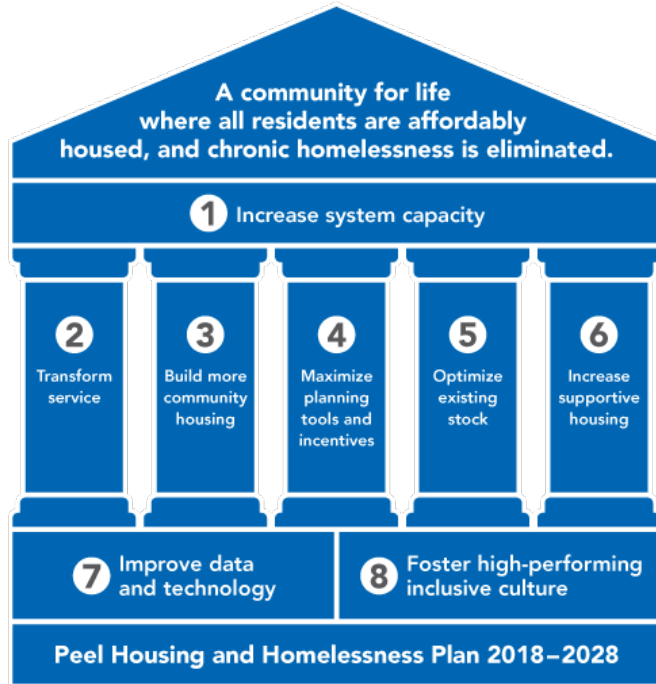
Lack of deeply affordable and supportive housing

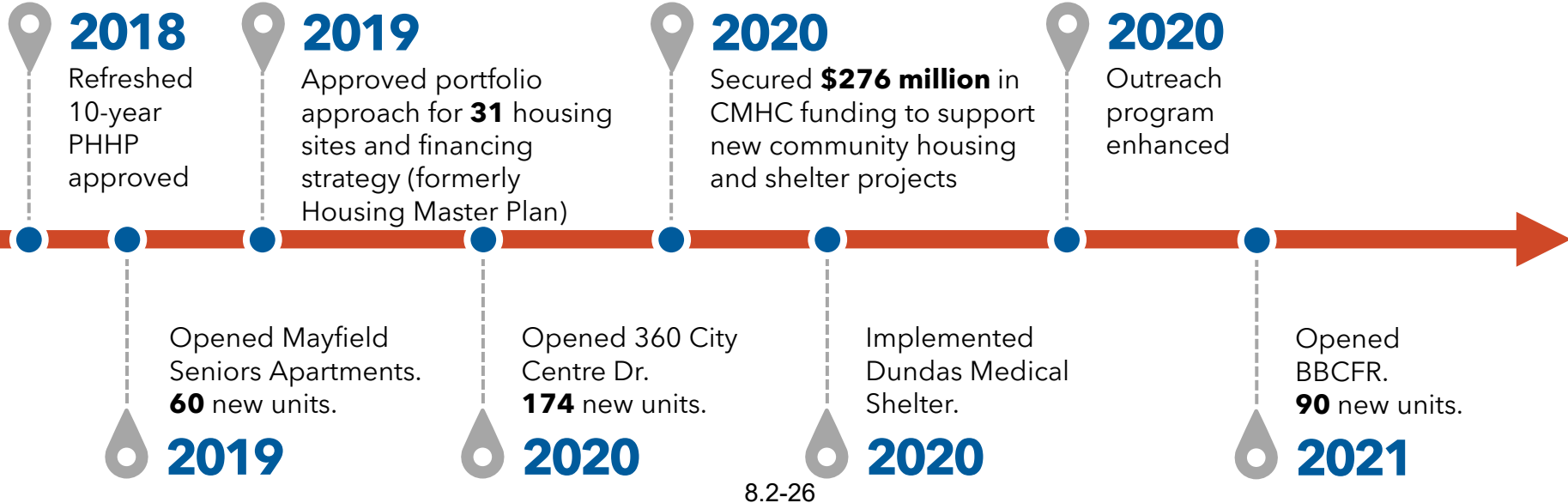
Peel's Housing and Homelessness Plan

2018 | Net operating budget: \$127.9 million

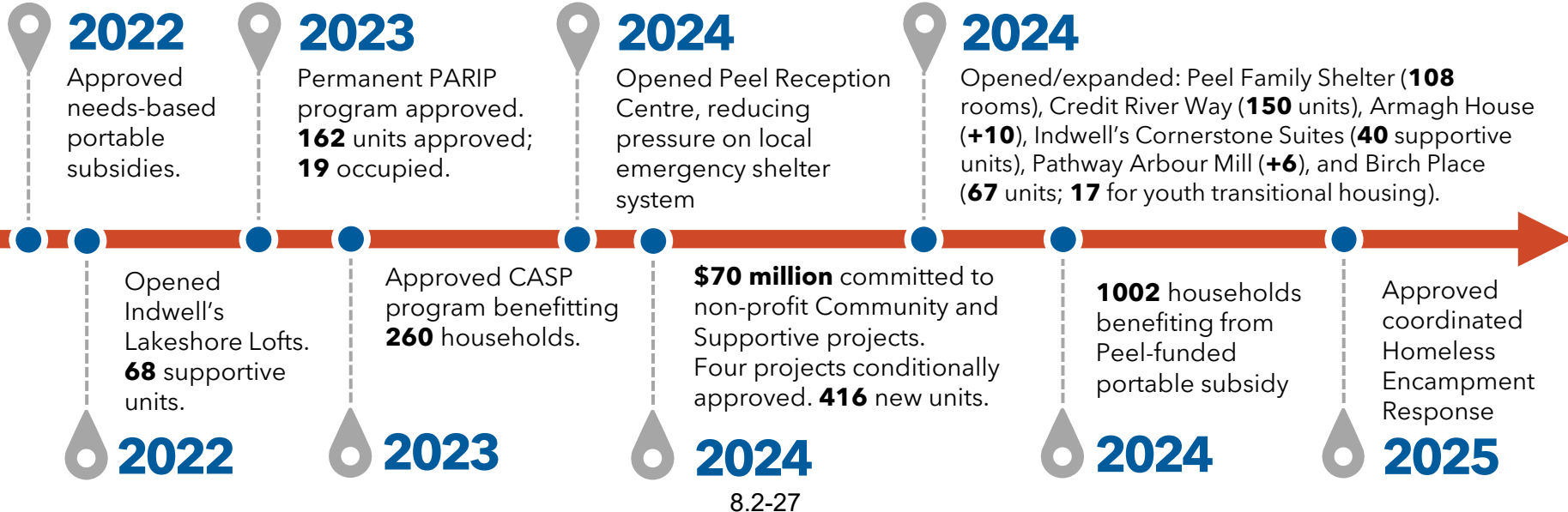

Net operating budget: \$219 million | 2025
