- This year, PCAWA is a co-lead of the campaign to ensure meaningful inclusion of community voices and lived experiences into campaign planning, implementation, and evaluation.

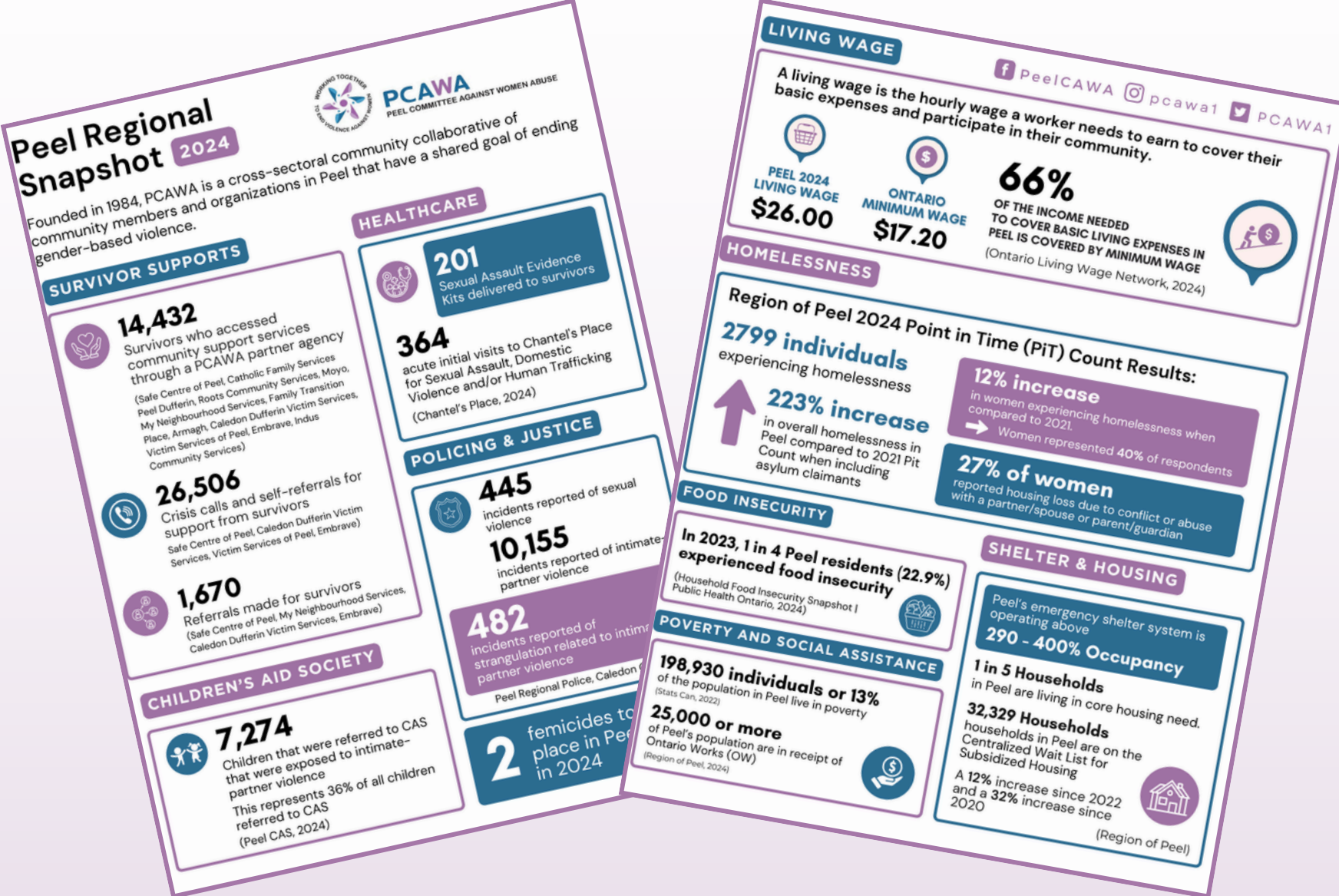
2024 Peel Regional Snapshot

HOMELESSNESS

Region of Peel 2024 Point in Time (PiT) Count Results:

2799 individuals experiencing homelessness

12% increase in women experiencing homelessness when compared to 2021.

→ Women represented **40%** of PiT Count respondents

223% increase

↑ in overall homelessness in Peel compared to 2021 PiT Count when including asylum claimants

27% of women

reported housing loss due to conflict or abuse with a partner/spouse or parent/guardian

SHELTER & HOUSING

Peel's emergency shelter system is operating above **290 - 400% Occupancy**
